## **MDC Transition - Community Homes**

#### Monthly Update – November 2023

(NOTE: New information is identified in **bold** print)

Efforts made to facilitate person centered plans and create a real home for each person:

- The transition process encourages individuals and their support networks to be involved in the entire transition.
- A person-centered plan is completed with each individual and their support network (including family members and substitute decision makers).
- Individual's moving have choices as where to live and with whom they might like to share a home with. If the individual is not able to communicate their wishes, family members and/or long-time support staff assist the transition team to determine what would be ideal for that individual.
- Service providers receive detailed personal information on the specific needs and interests of
  individuals they are planning to support. Checklists are in place to aid in sharing of personal,
  medical, and care needs. These needs are reviewed as part of the transition planning. For
  example, medications, routine for bathing, communication style, favourite items, favourite foods,
  fun activities, etc.
- A transition plan is developed and tailored to the individuals needs. They have opportunities to visit their new home prior to moving (the number of visits is person-centered). Service providers/staff also visit MDC to build rapport with the person and get to know their likes and dislikes
- A detailed plan is created with community support to ensure that there are supports in place prior to the individual's move. These clinical supports would be similar to the supports the individual had during their time at MDC and may include: Nurse Consultants, Occupational Therapist, Behaviour Specialist, Home Care, Pharmacist, Psychologist, Manitoba Home Nutrition Program, etc. The Clinicians are consulted during the transition process and available for ongoing follow-up as required.
- If the individual chooses, MDC support staff may assist the individual to move into their new home and are available as required following the move. MDC support staff may travel with the individual on moving day and remain with them to ensure they are comfortable and to answer any questions their new support staff may have.
- Once the individual moves, the Transition Team is available for follow up and to answer questions. Each region has assigned one Community Services Worker to ensure that all people moving to that region have regularly oversight and support.

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At start of transition, 133 individuals resided at MDC, then one individual was admitted for a temporary placement, resulting in 134 individuals to transition from MDC.
